

I. CALL PUBLIC MEETING TO ORDER

Mayor Pro Tem Fowler called the public meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Pro Tem Kevin Fowler and Council Members Patrick Trowbridge, John Hohenshelt, and Bennie Daniels. Also present were City Manager Rick Crowley, Assistant City Managers Mary Smith and Joey Boyd and the city's legal counsel, Patrick Lindner. Council Members Dana Macalik and Trace Johannesen were absent from the meeting. Mayor Pruitt arrived to the meeting at 6:16 p.m. as noted below.

II. WORK SESSION

 Hold a work session to discuss and consider implementing the use of a tool created by the Planning and Zoning Department in conjunction with zoning cases, and take any action necessary.

Planning Director Ryan Miller addressed the Council concerning this work session item. He shared general details pertaining to a tool that has been created that will help with conducting cost/benefit analyses for zoning cases. Overall, Council seemed to be in favor of the tool and provided positive feedback overall. Council took no action as a result of this work session discussion.

2. Hold a work session to discuss and consider strategies for the IH-30 Corridor as stated in the IH-30 Corridor Planning Study, and take any action necessary.

Mr. Miller also spoke to the Council concerning this work session agenda item. He shared both "defensive" and "offensive" strategies concerning future development (and redevelopment) of the portion of IH-30 that runs through the City of Rockwall. Trends related to "big box stores" and retailers, in general, were discussed. Council did not express any specific concerns about the information Mr. Miller presented. No formal action was taken as a result of these discussions.

3. Hold work session to discuss the "Staffing and Adequate Fire and Emergency Response" (S.A.F.E.R.) Grant Program through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (F.E.M.A.)

Fire Chief Kenneth Cullins came forth and addressed Council concerning this work session item. He explained that this grant program helps communities meet industry minimum standards and attain 24-hour staffing to provide adequate protection from fire and fire-related hazards, and to fulfill traditional missions of fire departments. He generally indicated that staff would like to evaluate Council's interest in city staff potentially submitting a grant application on behalf of the Rockwall Fire Department, specifically for staffing. He explained that it is a 3-year grant program, and the grant would pay:

- Year 1 75% of the annual cost of a first-year firefighter
 - Year 2 75% of the annual cost of a first-year firefighter
 - Year 3 35% of the annual cost of a first-year firefighter
 - Year 4 and beyond City picks up 100% of the cost

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Staff shared information on projected base salary and benefits package costs to fund 12 personnel (through taking advantage of grant funding). Chief Cullins explained that this proposal, if the grant funds were awarded, would bring minimum staffing to 12 (3 per each of the city's four fire stations). Following the discussion, Mayor Pro Tem Fowler pointed out that this topic appears later on this evening under "Action Items." No action was taken at this time.

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At 5:11 p.m., Mayor Pro Tem Fowler read the below discussion items into the public record before recessing the meeting to go into Executive Session.

Councilman Trowbridge seconded the motion, which passed by a vote of 4 ayes with 3 absences (Macalik, Pruitt and Johannesen).

Planning Director Ryan Miller provided brief background information pertaining to this agenda item, sharing that the City Council directed staff to create a land use for Barns or Agricultural Accessory Buildings. This came after receiving a request from Dewayne Cain to amend the code to allow an ~4,950 SF, metal barn that would contain a storage area for eight (8) vehicles and a guest quarters/secondary living facility (i.e. the facility includes all components of a residential living unit [e.g. kitchen, bathroom, etc.]) on a property zoned Agricultural (AG) District.

- 175 Mayor Pro Tem Fowler opened the public hearing and asked if anyone would like to come forth and 176 speak at this time. There being no one indicating such, he then closed the public hearing.
- Following brief discussion, Councilmember Daniels moved to approve Z2019-001. Mayor Pro Tem Fowler seconded the motion. The ordinance caption was read as follows:

Harr Survey, Abstract No. 102, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Agricultural (AG) District, situated within the SH-205 By-Pass Overlay (SH-205 BY OV) District, located east of the intersection of Justin Road and John King Boulevard, and take any action necessary (2nd Reading).

Mayor Pro Tem Fowler moved to approve Z2018-056. Councilmember Trowbridge seconded the motion. The ordinance caption was read as follows:

The motion passed by a vote of 4 ayes, 1 nay (Hohenshelt) and 2 absences (Macalik and Johannesen).

2. A2018-005 - Discuss and consider a request by Suresh Shridharani on behalf of the owner Harlan Properties Inc. for the approval of an ordinance for the annexation of a 79.564-acre tract of land identified as Tract 3 of the J. Merriman Survey, Abstract No. 155, Rockwall County, Texas, and take any action necessary (1st Reading).

Planning Director Ryan Miller provided background information pertaining to this agenda item. On February 19, 2019, the City Council will be considering the first reading of an annexation ordinance proposing the voluntary annexation of 69.679-acres of land located north and northeast of the intersection of FM-550 and SH-276 and located within the City's Extraterritorial Jurisdiction (ETJ). Suresh Shridharani on behalf of Harlan Properties, Inc. is requesting the annexation for the purpose of incorporating the property into the City of Rockwall to develop a residential subdivision. Staff should note, that since the property is not contiguous to the City's corporate limits, an additional 9.885-acres of SH-276 right-of-way will also need to be annexed along with the subject property. The City Council conducted the required hearings (first and second) on January 22 2019, and staff has followed the procedures for annexations as set forth in Chapter 43, Municipal Annexations, of the Texas Local Government Code (TLGC) with regard to notifying affected property owners and publishing notices in the newspaper and on the City's website.

Indication was given that the applicant has given preliminary indication that they would like to utilize this area for residential homes with septic tank service. Discussion ensued pertaining to one acre versus one-and-a-half acre residential lots. Mayor Pruitt pointed out that if this developer built this subdivision while "in the county," they would have to do so on 1.5 acre lots; however, if the city annexes this area, they have the ability to ask for approval of 1 acre lots (with septic) instead. This would, of course, be at the Council's discretion.

Councilmember Hohenshelt moved to approve A2018-005. Councilmember Trowbridge seconded the motion. The ordinance was read as follows:

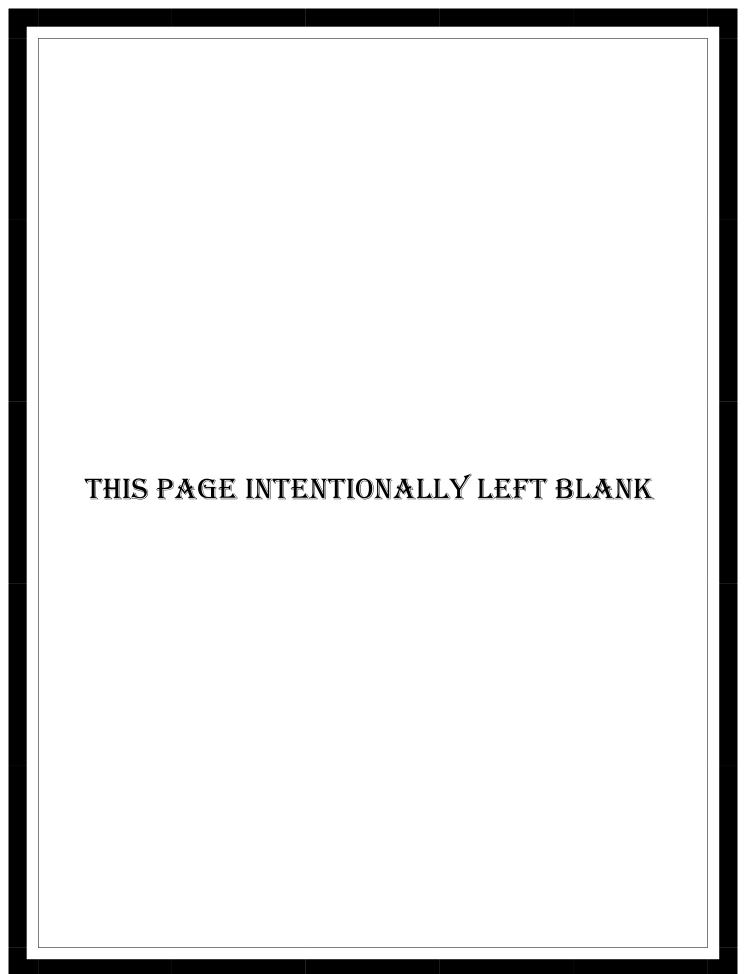

The motion passed by a vote of 4 ayes, 1 against (Pruitt) and 2 absences (Macalik and Johannesen).

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, AMENDING THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE [ORDINANCE NO. 04-38] OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, BY AMENDING ARTICLE IV, PERMISSIBLE USES TO AMEND THE LAND USE STANDARDS FOR GUEST QUARTERS/SECONDARY LIVING UNITS, AND TO ADD A LAND USE FOR BARNS OR AGRICULTURAL ACCESSORY BUILDINGS; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, an amendment to the City of Rockwall's Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 04-38*] has been initiated by the City Council of the City of Rockwall to amend Article IV, *Permissible Uses*, of the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 04-38*]; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Rockwall and the governing body of the City of Rockwall in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of Rockwall have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have held public hearings and afforded a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally and to all persons interested in and situated in the city's corporate boundaries, and the governing body in the exercise of its legislative discretion, has concluded that the Unified Development Code [Ordinance No. 04-38] should be amended as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Article IV, *Permissible Uses*, of the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 04-38*] of the City of Rockwall, as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby amended as specifically described in *Exhibit* 'A' of this ordinance.

SECTION 2. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a penalty of fine not to exceed the sum of *Two Thousand Dollars* (\$2,000.00) for each offense and each and every day such offense shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense;

SECTION 3. That if any section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of that section, paragraph, or provision to any person, firm, corporation or situation is for any reason judged invalid, the adjudication shall not affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of any other section, paragraph or provision to any other person, firm, corporation or situation, nor shall adjudication affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 04-38*], and the City Council declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of the ordinance without the invalid parts and to this end the provisions for this ordinance are declared to be severable;

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption of said ordinance as the law in such cases provides;

Section 2.1.1: Rural and Animal Related


Barn or Agricultural Accessory Building. A Barn or Agricultural Accessory Building is a building that is located on a property that is a minimum of ten (10) acres in size, zoned Agricultural (AG) District, and is intended to be used to store agricultural equipment used for animal production, crop production and/or other agricultural related uses.

- (1) A Barn or Agricultural Accessory Building is a minimum of 2,000 SF and a maximum of 4,999 SF in total size (i.e. under roof).
- (2) A Barn or Agricultural Accessory Building is exempt from the masonry requirements stipulated by Section 7.01, Residential District Development Standards.
- (3) The Barn or Agricultural Accessory Building shall be located behind the front façade of the primary structure, and be subject to the same building setbacks as the primary structure.

Section 2.1.2: Residential and Lodging Use Conditions

Guest quarters/secondary living unit.

- (1) Guest quarters or secondary living units may be allowed on a property in a residential or commercial zoning district provided that it is ancillary to a single family home the primary use and that only one such facility is provided.
- (2) The area of such quarters shall not exceed 30 percent of the area of the main structure.
- (3) No such use may be sold or conveyed separately without meeting the requirements of the zoning district and the subdivision ordinance.
- (4) Guest quarters or secondary living units not meeting the requirements stated above shall require a Specific Use Permit (SUP).

MERRIMAN SURVEY, ABSTRACT NO. 155, ROCKWALL COUNTY, TEXAS, WHICH SAID TERRITORY LIES ADJACENT TO AND ADJOINS THE PRESENT BOUNDARY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Public Hearings were held before the governing body of the City of Rockwall, Texas, where all interested persons were provided with an opportunity to be heard, on January 22 2019, at 6:00 p.m. and on January 22 2019, at 6:30 p.m. at *City Hall, 385 S. Goliad*, Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, with said dates being not more than forty (40) days nor less than twenty (20) days prior to the institution of annexation proceedings, on the proposed annexation of the following described territories;

BEING, a 79.564-acre tract of land identified as Tract 3 of the J. Merriman Survey, Abstract No. 155 in the County of Rockwall, Texas and generally located contiguous to the existing city limits line north and northeast of the intersection of FM-550 and SH-276, depicted and described in *Exhibit 'A'* of this ordinance:

WHEREAS, notice of such public hearings were published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas and in the territory described herein on November 16, 2018 and posted on the City of Rockwall's website on January 4 2019 said dates being not more than twenty (20) days nor less than ten (10) days prior to the dates of such public hearings; and

WHEREAS, the territory lies adjacent to and adjoins the present boundaries of the City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the territory above contains 76.564-acres;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the above recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and incorporated herein for all purposes.

SECTION 2. The land and territory more specifically depicted in *Exhibit 'A'* and incorporated by reference as the *Subject Property*, and containing 79.564-acres which is adjacent to and adjoining the present boundaries of the City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, is hereby added and annexed to the City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas and said territory as described herein shall hereafter be included within the boundary limits of the City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas and the present boundary limits of the City at the various points contiguous to the areas as described above, are altered and amended so as to include said area within the corporate limits of the City.

SECTION 3. That the official map of the City is hereby amended to reflect the addition of the property described herein.

SECTION 4. The above described territory and the acres so annexed shall be a part of the City of Rockwall, Texas, and the inhabitants thereof, if any, shall be entitled to all of the rights and privileges of all citizens and shall be bound by the acts, ordinances, resolutions and regulations of the City of Rockwall, Texas.



<u>Date of Adoption of Annexation Ordinance:</u> March 4, 2019

Municipal services to the acreage described above shall be furnished by or on behalf of the City of Rockwall, Texas, at the following levels and in accordance with the following schedule:

(A) Police Services

- (1) Patrolling, responses to calls, and other routine police services, within the limits of existing personnel and equipment, will be provided within 60 days of the effective date of annexation.
- (2) As development and construction commence within this area, sufficient police personnel and equipment will be provided to continue to furnish this area the level of police services consistent with police services available in other parts of the City with land uses and population densities similar to those projected in the annexed area.

(B) Fire Services

- (1) Fire protection by the present personnel and the present equipment of the fire Department, within the limitations of available water and distances from existing fire stations, will be provided to this area within 60 days of the effective date of annexation.
- (2) As development and construction commences within this area, sufficient fire personnel and equipment will be provided to continue to furnish this area the level of fire services consistent with fire service available in other parts of the City with land uses and population densities similar to those projected in the annexed area.

(C) Health and Code Compliance Services

- (1) Enforcement of the City's health ordinances and regulations including, but not limited to, weed and brush ordinances, junked and abandoned vehicle ordinances, food handlers ordinances and animal control ordinances, shall be provided within this area on the effective date of the annexation ordinance. These ordinances and regulations will be enforced through the use of existing personnel. Complaints of ordinance or regulation violations within this area will be responded and investigated by existing personnel beginning with the effective date of the annexation ordinance.
- (2) The City's building, plumbing, electrical, gas heating, air conditioning and all other construction codes will be enforced within this area beginning with the effective date of the annexation ordinance. Existing personnel will be used to provide these services.

Exhibit 'B'

Service Plan

- (3) The City's zoning, subdivision, and other ordinances shall be enforced in this area beginning on the effective date of the annexation ordinance.
- (4) All inspection services furnished by the City of Rockwall, but not mentioned above, will be provided to this area beginning on the effective date of the annexation ordinance. Any property owner or his/her assigns who in good faith has a new building or structure, as defined in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, under construction on the effective date of annexation shall be exempted from these inspections for that building or structure under construction for a period of one year from the effective date of annexation. For the purpose of this ordinance "under construction" shall mean any work that requires a building permit from the City of Rockwall.
- (5) As development and construction commence within this area, sufficient personnel will be provided to continue to furnish this area the same level of Health and Code compliance services as are furnished throughout the City.

(D) Planning and Zoning Services

(1) The planning and zoning jurisdiction of the City will extend to this area on the effective date of the annexation ordinance. City planning will thereafter encompass this property, and it shall be entitled to consideration for zoning in accordance with the City's Comprehensive Plan, Zoning Ordinance, Landscape Ordinance and Code of Ordinances.

(E) Recreation and Leisure Services

- (1) Residents of this property may utilize all existing recreational and leisure services facilities and sites throughout the City beginning with the effective date of the annexation ordinance.
- (2) Existing parks, playgrounds, swimming pools and other recreation and leisure facilities within this property shall, upon dedication to and acceptance by the City, be maintained and operated by the City of Rockwall.

(F) Solid Waste Collection

(1) Solid waste collection shall be provided to the property owner in accordance with existing City policies as to frequency and charges, beginning on the effective date of annexation except for properties that are served by a privately owned solid waste management service provider. Such properties will be allowed to continue private service for a period of two years from the effective date of annexation at which time the property will be required to begin service with a franchised solid waste contractor within the City of Rockwall.

(G) Streets

(1) The City of Rockwall's existing policies with regard to street maintenance, applicable throughout the entire City, shall apply to this property beginning immediately as of the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

- (2) As development, improvements or construction of streets to the City standards commence within this property, the policies of the City of Rockwall with regard to impact fees and participation in the cost thereof, acceptance upon completion, and maintenance after completion, shall apply.
- (3) The same level of maintenance shall be provided to streets within this property that have been accepted by the City of Rockwall as is provided to like City streets throughout the City.

(H) Water Services

- (1) Connection to existing City water mains for water services for domestic, commercial and industrial use within this property will be provided in accordance with existing City policies. Upon connection to existing mains, water will be provided at rates established by City ordinance for such services throughout the City.
- (2) Water mains of the City will be extended in accordance with provisions of the Code of Ordinances and other applicable ordinances and regulations. City participation in the costs of these extensions shall be in accordance with applicable City ordinances and regulations and will be provided as otherwise available in other parts of the City with topography, land uses, population densities similar to those reasonably contemplated or projected in the annexed area.
- (3) Water mains which are within the annexed area and are owned and operated by the City shall be maintained beginning with the effective date of the annexation ordinance or upon acquisition by the City.
- (4) Private water lines within this property shall be maintained by their owners, in accordance with existing policies applicable throughout the City.

(I) Sanitary Sewer Services

- (1) Connections to existing City sanitary sewer mains for sanitary sewage service in this area will be provided in accordance with the existing City policies. Upon connection, sanitary sewage service will be provided at rates established by City ordinances for such services throughout the City.
- (2) Sanitary sewer mains and/or lift stations which are within the annexed area and are connected to City mains shall be maintained by the City of Rockwall beginning with the effective date of the annexation ordinance or upon acquisition by the City.
- (3) Sanitary sewer mains of the City will be extended in accordance with the provisions of the Code of Ordinances and engineering standards and other applicable ordinances and regulations. City participation in the costs of these extensions shall be in accordance with applicable City ordinances and regulations and will be provided as otherwise availably in other parts of the City with topography, land uses, and population densities similar to those reasonably contemplated or projected in the area.
- (4) Previously granted exceptions to the requirements of connections to the city's sanitary sewer treatment system shall be continued until such alternate systems are


determined to no longer function to meet the sanitary sewer needs of the subdivision granted the exception.

(J) Public Utilities

(1) Other public utilities will be provided by the City's franchisee or a provider holding a certificate of convenience issued by the state to serve that area.

(1) General municipal administration services of the City shall be available to the annexed area beginning with the effective date of the annexation ordinance.

SUBJECT: Update to Fire Department First Responder Organization (FRO)

Agreement

During a recent review of the Rockwall Fire Department FRO agreement with Rockwall County EMS the City Attorney made some edits to the language in the following sections of the agreement:

- Article 1, sections 18 and 19
- Article 2, sections 6, 7, and 8

The edits will not materially change the manner in which the FRO program operates.

For council's consideration is the authorization for City Manager Rick Crowley to sign the new agreement.

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FIRST RESPONDER AGREEMENT FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE BETWEEN CITY OF ROCKWALL AND ROCKWALL COUNTY EMS

Whereas, the City of Rockwall Fire Department (First Responder) and Rockwall County EMS (Provider) are licensed by the Texas Department of State Health Services (TDSHS) as Emergency Medical Providers; and

Whereas, the City of Rockwall Fire Department is holding or seeking registration or reregistration by the Texas Department of State Health Services;

Rockwall County EMS, and the City of Rockwall Fire Department, a first responder organization agree to the following:

ARTICLE I

First Responder and Provider Responsibilities

- 1. First Responder personnel shall respond twenty-four hours per day, seven days a week for EMS assists.
- 2. The First Responder shall receive notification of calls via the Rockwall Police Department communications center.
- 3. First Responder personnel response codes policies shall be prescribed by the Rockwall Fire Department Standard Operating Guidelines.
- 4. The Provider will assist the First Responder in the development of written protocols and procedures.
- 5. First Responder patient care shall be done following the protocols and procedures approved by the Medical Director for the Provider.
- 6. The Provider will assist the First Responder in developing a Quality Assurance Program.
- 7. The Provider will provide the First Responder Quality Assurance Template.
- 8. A written report shall be given to responding EMS unit anytime RFD makes patient contact prior to EMS arrival. The written report shall contain at a minimum patient name, chief complaint, pre hospital care provided, dispatch and arrival time and FRO personnel providing care.
- 9. In the event EMS personnel are unable to obtain patient refusals due to multiple patient care, RFD may obtain refusal signature(s) using appropriate paperwork provided by the EMS Provider.

- 10. First Responders shall be responsible for maintaining written and verbal patient confidentiality.
- 11. The First Responder shall be held to the same standards of professional ethics, behavior, demeanor and patient care as the Provider.
- 12. Only the First Responder personnel currently certified, at minimum, at the EMT-Basic level by TDSHS or non-certified responders who have completed the EMS Provider's Medical Director's training curriculum will perform patient care.
- 13. When on the scene, all of the First Responder personnel will be identified by at least the following: Rockwall Fire Department, first initial and last name of the individual and the level of TDSHS certification.
- 14. The equipment and supplies will be listed and have written approval by the Medical Director for the Provider.
- 15. First Responder shall provide all equipment used in patient treatment. The Provider shall replace all supplies used by the First Responder in the course of treatment including oxygen. Equipment and supplies will be inventoried, recovered from the scene if possible or from EMS central office as soon as the run is over, stored and maintained in an appropriate manner. The First Responder will not carry or use ALS supplies.
- 16. First Responder personnel shall not practice beyond their individual training and shall not exceed the BLS level of patient care outlined in the protocols and procedures.
- 17. Provider personnel on scene will be in charge of patient care.
- 18. Anytime First Responder personnel are requested to accompany the Provider in transporting the patient to the hospital they will do so including driving Provider's ambulance in order to allow two paramedics to treat the patient. Upon Paramedic Supervisor request there will be a maximum of one responder per engine allowed to accompany EMS to the Hospital.
- 19. The Provider shall not be responsible for care rendered, accidents, injuries, exposures or any liability involving First Responder Personnel, equipment, or vehicles. The First Responder shall not be responsible for care rendered, accidents, injuries, exposures or any liability involving Provider Personnel, equipment or vehicles.
- 20. First Responder personnel are not only allowed, but also invited to attend the Provider monthly CE meetings. Provider will be responsible for all AED, CRP and Protocol training/testing.

- 21. FRO personnel have the authority to disregard the EMS Provider when the following scenarios are present:
 - a. No sick/no injured
 - b. Unable to Locate (UTL)
- 22. Patient Information. On the arrival of Providers' ambulance, patient care will be released from the First Responders to the Providers' personnel with the following information:
 - a. Description of situation upon arrival;
 - b. Patient condition, vital signs, known past and present medical history, medications and allergies;
 - c. Care rendered and the patient's response to that care.
- 23. Patient Care Forms. The First Responders will ensure that Patient Care forms are available at every scene, and properly filled out for every patient, including "no transports". Requests for completed patient care forms must be made to the First Responders' Fire Chief and a copy of the completed patient care report form will be sent to the requesting Provider within ten (10) days of the request. The First Responders will maintain copies of all patient report forms.
- 24. First Responders have the authority to terminate Providers' responding ambulances, in the event of the following, once patient contact is initiated:
 - a. Obvious death
 - b. Patient refusal as determined by the Provider.


If the First Responder terminated the Provider response, then the First Responder will responsible for full documentation of the incident.

ARTICLE II Miscellaneous

- I. Provider Liability. The Provider will not be liable for patient care rendered, training accidents, injuries, exposures or any liability involving First Responders' personnel, equipment, supplies or vehicles.
- 2. If any party of this Agreement is sued by a third party for any acts or omissions arising from the performance of this Agreement, the Parties may be a "Governmental Unit" as that term is defined in Section 101.001 (3) of the Texas Civil Practice Code. The Parties further understand and agree that such Parties are entitled to the rights, protections and limitations which Title 5 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code provides for Governmental Units, including the limitations offered under Chapter 10I of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code.

- 3. Each party further agrees to defend, at its own expense, and on behalf of itself and the other party, any claim or litigation brought against it in connection with any such injury, death, or damage caused solely through the negligent or other wrongful conduct of either entity in carrying out this Agreement.
- 4. This Agreement will be interpreted according to the laws of the State of Texas. Venue of any court action brought directly or indirectly by reason of this Agreement shall be in Rockwall County, Texas.
- 5. This Agreement constitutes the final and entire agreement between the parties. It contains all of the terms and conditions agreed upon. No other agreements, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement shall be deemed to exist or to bind the parties. This Agreement may be amended by the mutual written agreement of the Parties.
- 6. Neither this agreement nor any duties or obligations hereunder shall be assignable by any party without the prior written consent of all other party and any assignment without the written consent of a non-assigning party shall be null and void.
- 7. Term & Effective Date. This Agreement shall become effective on the last date of execution following the approval of this Agreement by the Parties and shall expire on the expiration date of the Provider contract with the Rockwall County Emergency Services Corporation.
- 8. Notwithstanding the term of the Agreement, either party shall have the right to terminate said agreement upon thirty days' (30) written notice to the other party.





ORDINANCE NO. 19-___

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS DECLARING UNOPPOSED CANDIDATES FOR THE OFFICES OF MAYOR AND CITY COUNCILMEMBER PLACE 1, CITY COUNCILMEMBER PLACE 3, AND CITY COUNCILMEMBER PLACE 5, AS ELECTED; PROVIDING THAT THE MAY 4, 2019 GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION SHALL NOT BE HELD; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; FINDING AND DETERMINDING THAT THE MEETING AT WHICH THIS ORDINANCE WAS PASSED WAS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AS REQUIRED BY LAW; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Rockwall, Texas adopted Resolution No. 19-03 on February 4, 2019, ordering a general election to be held on May 4, 2019, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and three additional city officials - City Councilmember Place 1, City Councilmember Place 3, and City Councilmember Place 5; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 143.007 and 146.054, Texas Election Code, the deadline for filing applications for a place on the ballot and declaration of write-in candidacy for the City's general election have expired; and

WHEREAS, the City Secretary, in accordance with Section 2.052, Texas Election code, has certified in writing, attached hereto as Exhibit 'A', to the City Council that Jim Pruitt is unopposed for election to the office of Mayor; Bennie Daniels is unopposed for election to the office of Councilmember Place 1; Kevin Fowler is unopposed for election to the office of Councilmember Place 3, and Dana K. Macalik is unopposed for election to the office of Councilmember Place 5; and

WHEREAS, the City Council herby finds and determines that the candidates whose names were to appear on the ballot in said election are unopposed, that there are no declared write-in candidates, and that no propositions are to appear on the ballot for said election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. The facts and matters set forth in the preamble of this Ordinance are hereby found to be true and correct;

Section 2. In accordance with Section 2.053(a), Texas Election Code, the following unopposed candidates are hereby declared duly elected to the respective offices for a term of two years and shall be issued a certificate of election following the date on which the general election for Councilmembers would have otherwise been held:

- Jim Pruitt Mayor
- Bennie Daniels Councilmember, Place 1
- Kevin Fowler Councilmember, Place 3
- Dana K. Macalik Councilmember, Place 5

Section 3. Pursuant to Section 2.053(b), Texas Election code, the general municipal election for Mayor and Councilmember Place 1, Councilmember Place 3, and Councilmember Place 5 called and ordered by Resolution No. 19-03, for May 4, 2019, shall not be held and is hereby cancelled.

Section 4. The City Secretary is hereby directed to cause a copy of this Ordinance to be posted on Election Day, same being May 4, 2019, at all posting places that would have been used in said election.

Section 5. Term of office for the unopposed Mayor and Councilmembers shall commence on May 20, 2019 after the Oath of Office has been administered and executed.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 7. The Code of the City of Rockwall, Texas, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect, save and except as amended by this ordinance.

Section 8. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any purpose by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 9. It is hereby found and determined that the meeting at which this ordinance was passed was open to the public as required by Section 551.001 et seq., Texas Government Code, and that advance public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given.

Section 10. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its second reading as required by the City Charter, Section 3.11.




SUBJECT: Special permit request for a front yard fence at 318 Cooper Court

Phillip and Mary Weber have requested to appear before the Council to seek approval of a special permit for a front yard fence for their property located at 318 Cooper Court, within The Preserve Phase 1.

Mr. and Mrs. Weber would like to build a 48" wrought iron fence within the front yard of the property to provide the required pool barrier for a proposed pool.

The Weber's property has a double frontage, with a required 25' building line setback. Therefore, the proposed fence location is considered a front yard fence, necessitating City Council approval. The Weber's propose to build a swimming pool in the location depicted on the attached exhibit. Their rear yard is fairly shallow and a drainage swale crosses the rear yard taking drainage from the west to Potomac Drive. Therefore, a very limited area exists to construct a pool within their rear yard.

I am including a portion of the plat, showing the subject property and the proposed location for the pool and fence. In addition, I've provided pictures of the surrounding area for your review.










FEE BASED PROGRAM REVENUE BY MONTH






